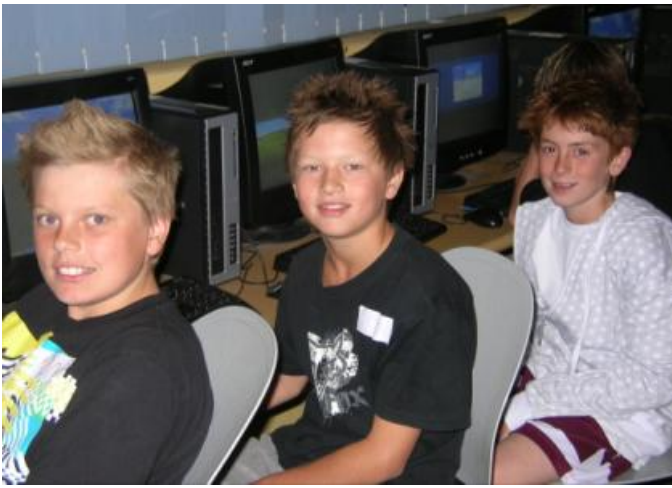
Ivan is Retiring!

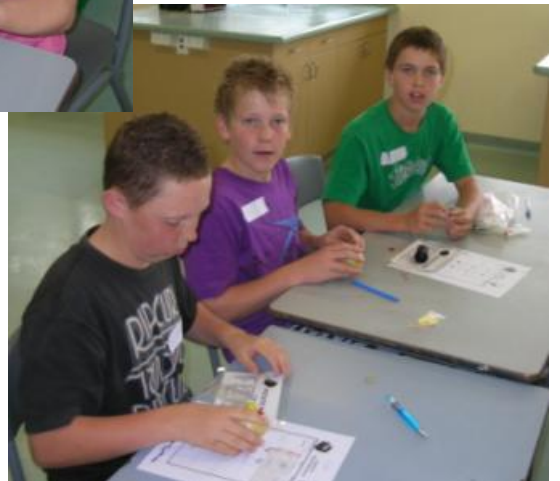

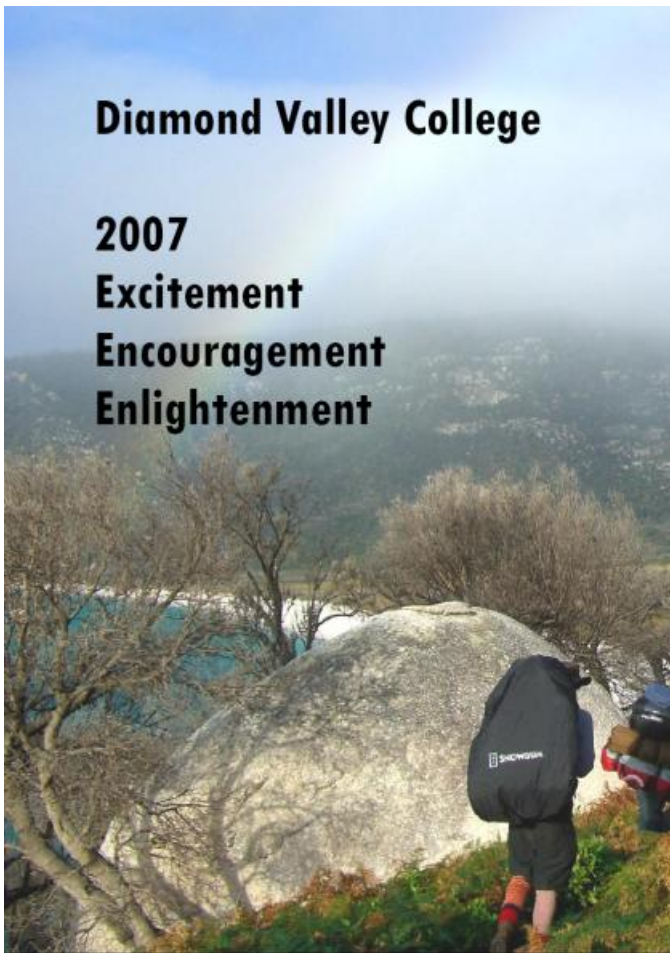
