Principal's Report

It is great to be able to share the news that we have employed an experienced Wood teacher, Simon Berriman, who joins us next week.

I want to thank our amazing staff who have been working incredibly hard over the last few weeks to ensure all classes are covered, preparing work to ensure a viable and consistent program, in some cases reshuffling their schedules to ensure our students are supported whilst we wait for employment of two new teachers in the areas of Food and Italian. With a general teacher shortage across the state including replacement teachers this poses a new problem for both state and independent schools. Our leadership team have had to be very solution focused to ensure our programs and extracurricular activities can go ahead with minimal disruptions to our students and supporting the health and wellbeing of our staff. Whilst these issues in the short term can be challenges, in the long term they provide us with an increased range of tools and strategies that we can implement in the future.

We have had so many exciting events on our calendar including excursions and incursions some of which are Year 9 Man Cave, Monash University coming to speak with our aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, Chocolate Factory Tour, Dante Aligarti Italian Poetry Finals, Women's Soccer World Cup – Nigeria vs Canada, just to name a few. We also continue many programs to support our students including Literacy and Numeracy tutoring, Raise, Edendale Farm and Open House, a weekly visit to Ellis Cottage, Tri Tactics and a new program for a number of our Kinglake students – Blue Edge, and many careers focused opportunities and experiences.

The production of Annie is full steam ahead with all of Act 1 being completed and now focusing on Act 2. We have a number of students who are part of our choir, and it was a privilege to attend the Winter Concert on Monday night and watch our students support one another and work together to produce a fabulous evening. Well done to all our students who performed and thank you to our Performing Arts staff for ensuring our students have these opportunities to develop their skills and talents, perseverance, and resilience to perform in front of family and friends.

Year 7 and 9 will get their NAPLAN results in the coming days by post. This year new standards for assessing NAPLAN have been introduced - Exceeding: Strong: Developing: Needs additional support. A number of our Year 9 students have achieved certificates for the exceeding category which is fantastic, and we will hand these out in a Year 9 assembly in the coming weeks.

We had our college assembly last Friday which was run by our School Captains and Vice captains and featured our choir, a Year 12 oral presentation, student promotion of Annie, College Principal address and sporting achievement presentation. These are great opportunities to come together as a college to celebrate the wonderful things that our students are doing and achieving in the college. A big thank you to Kim Faulkner – Transition and Community Engagement Co-ordinator for organising this event. Leadership has signed off on the mid cycle review of the AIP and we begin to prepare for our upcoming college review starting in the next few weeks. More about this in coming weeks.

Next week it will be great to welcome Allison back to the college. It has been a pleasure to step into her role for the last few weeks and work with the college community to ensure our students continue to strive to achieve their best.



ATTENTION APPLICATION TO TRAVEL FORMS 2024

PLEASE READ ALL INFORMATION AND NOTE BUS TRAVELLER PROCEDURES.

THESE PROCEDURES ARE DIRECTIVES FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND PUBLIC TRANSPORT VICTORIA.

Parents and students please note that <u>all</u> bus travellers <u>must</u> complete an Application to Travel form for the 2024 school year. These forms are available for download from the Diamond Valley College website or by clicking on the following link <u>2024 Bus Application</u> Applications should be completed <u>in full</u>, including a <u>valid personal parent email</u> please do not use a business email address and returned to the General Office no later than Friday 15th September 2023 to allow planning for the 2024 school year. Students will <u>not be permitted to travel</u> via the College Bus Network without a current "Application to Travel" form, regardless of eligibility.

Regardless of your child's years of travel, or eligibility these processes need to be followed for each new year of travel.

The application form must be completed in full including the <u>correct bus</u> and stop as indicated on the relevant timetable available on the College website. Should you not nominate a preferred bus, one will be allocated to you on the basis of location and availability.

Late forms will be accepted, however no guarantees are given regarding a place on the preferred bus. Every endeavour will be made to accommodate students on their requested bus.
